Professional Learning Communities ensure that teachers are continuously learning and supporting one another. Our Academic Coach, as well as AIG and inclusion EC teachers, support rigorous instruction while also supporting the unique needs of each student.

Developmental Responsiveness

HMS has incorporated a daily homeroom period which also acts as a mentor/mentee program. School expectations and procedures are explicitly taught and re-taught as needed and consistency is assessed and expected throughout the school. Our faculty understands the students differ and ensure that diversity in instructional strategies meet students' needs. School clubs and community partnerships support the 21st century skills and community involvement. Partnerships with our high school and community college keep our students focused on their futures and reaching for their goals.

Social Equity

HMS uses the inclusion model for our gifted and exceptional students with daily support from additional teachers. Co-teaching is the norm and ensures that support is offered to all students. Our first weeks of school are spent getting to know our students and what their various backgrounds and needs will mean for their school year.
