School Characteristics and Replicable Practices

Academic Excellence

- LCMS establishes clarity through communication with parents and students
 - Classroom academic and behavior expectations are presented online and by hard copy the first three days of school—signature required
 - All teachers have class web pages on which assignments are posted
- Multiple modalities are used to explain and model assignments
- Across all curricular areas, teachers expect students to complete high quality work using complete and correct sentences.
- Departments are now required to develop cross-curricular projects
- Curricula in all courses develop in a steady progression
- The importance of key concepts is underscored by their application to real world situations
- Teachers use multiple assessment mechanisms
- Rubrics for assignments are clear with self, peer, and teacher review
- Unique Schedule for intervention
 - o CAT: a multi-tiered intervention program

- Mandatory Strategies Courses
- Mandatory Study Skills courses
- o Drop in before-school tutoring

- o Twice weekly after-school tutoring in English language arts and math
- Zero period physical education class
- Faculty are required to join forces weekly on our shortened day designed for collaboration:
 - o Department meetings, grade level meetings, at-risk students meetings
 - Calendar cooperation so major projects have staggered due dates

Developmental Responsiveness

- Our mantra is: Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be Prepared
- Strive to educate the whole child, knowing on any given day, all middle school students may have a special need
- Adults on campus have the responsibility to get to know those we serve
- School Connectedness Groupings: randomly assigned 6th grade activity groups; multi-grade homeroom competitions; interest-oriented groups (chess, guitar, etc.); skills-oriented groups; Pal's lunch club; at-risk teams
- Services for all: educationally, medically, emotionally, financially
- Parents are informed about new programs and social topics at Parent Education Nights
- 97% attendance rate suggests our students want to be at school
- Students engage in group assignments/projects in all subject areas requiring the fine balance of task orientation and social/emotional needs
- Students have opportunities to learn their strengths, weaknesses, and interests
 - Exploratory rotation classes in all grade levels
 - One third of entire student body is enrolled in a performing music class
 - Enrichment classes during CAT
 - School projects to help community

Social Equity

- Regular and high offerings in most core subjects
- Physically handicapped students are accommodated in all class offerings
- Our campus offers Enhanced Day classes (formerly known as classes for Emotionally Disturbed who heretofore attended non-public schools)
- ELD class serves our English Language Learners
- Forward Learning: laptops provided for all students
- Academic Support Classes: A multi-tiered intervention program including CAT, Study Skills, and Strategies classes
- Varied (differentiated) delivery mechanisms of information and multiple options for students to demonstrate mastery of concepts

State Department of Education Middle Grades Office Rev. 2011

- Master schedule affords all students a chance to succeed
- Students are not tracked and can move fluidly amongst classes at the semester
- LCMS has an Ability Awareness Fair to promote understanding of physical handicaps
- Positive behavior (monthly BBQ and Cougar Club) is rewarded
- Penalties for poor behavior are clear and applied fairly to all

Developmental Structures and Processes

- School Site Council is comprised of all our partners: administration, teachers, parents, students, community members
- The principal encourages all to dialogue with her so that communication is not just downward
 - o Round table discussions with teachers, counselors and administrators to resolve any site issues
 - Parent Faculty Club meetings
- The principal encourages teachers to try new approaches and projects without fear of failure
- Teachers attend conferences for professional development
- Teachers are supported by the District Office, the School Site Council, and the PFC
- We have transition orientations between elementary schools and between the high school
- Barriers are challenges meant to overcome
- Multiple means of communication with our parents and community-at-large
- Community is supportive: recent bond measure vote passing by 72%
