Kearns Junior High is situated in the township of Kearns Utah in the Salt Lake Valley. Kearns is an urban community made up mostly of working class citizens. Most of the development of the community occurred in the late 50s through the early 70s.

The median income and home values are in the bottom 20% of Salt Lake County. The Hispanic population is the fastest growing ethnic group in Kearns comprising of 32.3% of the total population. The largest population of the Kearns community at 59.6% identifies themselves as White or Caucasian.
