
# School Characteristics and Replicable Practices

- 46% of 8<sup>th</sup> grade students currently enrolled in Integrated Algebra
- 40% of 8<sup>th</sup> grade students enrolled in Regents Earth Science
- All students have the opportunity to earn high school credit in World Languages
- · Acceleration available in Math, Science, World Languages
- · Academic Intervention Service classes/programs in Math, Science, English and World Languages

- Academic Support through summer program

- Fully inclusive classes
- · Co-teaching and consultant teaching models throughout grade levels
- · Focus on Core Principles of Kindness, Integrity, Fairness, Perseverance, Responsibility, Respect, and Empathy; student-created visuals and student-led instruction on core values through morning show
- · Character education embedded in all classes and Enrichment
- · Activity Nights PTSA Sponsored one Friday night per month, per grade
- · Weekly "Great Kid Of the Week" postcards mailed home focus on character
- Computers in all classrooms
- The building is wireless and contains mobile laptop carts
